Monday, March 13, 2017

Chairman O'Hara called the meeting to order at 1:00 pm. He called for public comment and heard none. Introductions were made.

Director Hinebauch made the motion to adopt the tentative agenda with changes and Director Myllymaki seconded it. The agenda passed unanimously.

Chairman O'Hara presented the minutes of the November 28-29, 2016 Board Meeting.

Director Mattelin moved and Director Myllymaki seconded the motion to approve the minutes. The motion passed unanimously.

Grain Trade Member Confirmed

Blake Malcolm introduced himself to the committee and gave background information.

Director Hinebauch made a motion to nominate Blake Malcolm the new Grain Trade Ex-Officio for the committee and Director Myllymaki seconded it. The nomination passed unanimously.

Financial Report and Collection Update

Executive Vice President Watters presented the Financial Report in the new format. It included Sponsorships and refunders.

MT Department of Agriculture Update

Kim Mangold gave the report for the department, the new director of Agriculture, Ben Thomas will be at the next meeting this summer. The next hail board meeting will take place in Lewistown on March 21st. The Pulse Advisory Board has a bill in the legislature to change the board into a working board like the Wheat & Barley Committee.

MSU Update

Dr. Boyer reported that current enrollment is strong at the university. The Experiment Stations will be effected by the state budget this year. The university is working on several endowed chairs in different fields of study.

Endowed Chair Update

Kevin Brown gave the committee an update on the endowed chair fund raising, they found a 2-million-dollar donor which leaves only \$300,000 to reach the 5-million-dollar goal. That donor will name the chair.

Dr. Budak resubmitted his proposal to reflect the change in the amount requested, \$41,250.00.

Director Mattelin made a motion to approve the new proposal and make changes to the budget to reflect the new amount, and Director Myllymaki seconded it. The motion passed unanimously.

“View from the Trade Report”

Blake Malcolm talked to the board about the reduction of acres for malt barley and replacing those acres with spring wheat, durum and pulse crops. The winter was not good for the railroads.

Wheat Foods Council Update

Director Conover attended the Wheat Foods Council Board meeting in Arizona, where they discussed the campaigns they are involved in with personal trainers. She believes that the group is doing a good job for the wheat industry.

U.S. Wheat Association Meeting

The USWA meeting was held in Washington DC and attended by Chairman O'Hara, Directors Kolstad, Schock and Conover and EV President Watters. Director Kolstad attended the auditors meeting where they receive a good report. Director Conover attended the Orientation and recommended that it is a great starting point for all new committee members.

U.S. Wheat Board Trip

Director Conover traveled to Thailand and the Philippines with USWA to tour several flour mills and meet with the companies that buy our wheat. She had a very eye-opening trip.

UES Meeting

Director Kolstad attended the USWA strategic plan meetings for Asia in Maymar. Each country represented at the conference presented reports, with after sales service and technical services. It was a lot of work.

U.S. Grains Council

Chairman O'Hara and Director Mattelin traveled to Panama for the USGC Board meeting, where they learned that the Latin America middle class is very large. They toured the renovated locks. The barley meeting talked about the demand for food barley in the Japanese market.

National Barley Growers Association

Director Mattelin, Chairman O'Hara and EV President Watters attended the NBGA in Washington DC before going to the USWA Meeting later in the week. The meeting had a great turn out and there were a lot of industry people in attendance. They met with a group of Senators and talked about trade issues.

Chairman O'Hara, EV President Watters, Deputy Director Mangold, Director of Ag Thomas, and Director Conover met with the Japanese Agriculture representative for over 1 ½ hours. He had many questions about trade issues and the future of working with the state of Montana.

National Barley Improvement Committee

Director Mattelin traveled to Washington DC to attend the NBIC where they visited the representatives on Capitol Hill to give information on barley. He also learned there are at least 5200 brewers in the U.S.

PGI & Wheat Quality Council

Director Hinebauch and Cassidy Marn attended the meetings in Kansas City, the merger between PGI and Wheat Quality probably won't happen any time soon. Montana will be doing grow-outs in Havre with the help of Peggy Lamb. Peggy should be taken to the meeting next year.

Outreach Coordinator Update

Steve Becker gave an update on his activities for the past couple months:

- State Communicators meeting was excellent and should be done every year, he had a handout for the committee.
- Producer Tour to Portland a good group, lots of good questions and discussions.
- Young Ag Couples, attendance seemed to be down.

- He is still working on transportation issues and maybe conducting a survey with the help of MGGA.
- We are also looking to hire an intern for the summer to help with social media and the web site.
